Orange County 2008 MIXED DOUBLES ~ Information for Captains

First... THANK YOU for being a captain! Without captains, players don't get to play, and not everyone is willing to step up to that plate. I sincerely appreciate all you do, and I know it's time consuming and not always easy.

Second, here is a list that will hopefully make your life easier, especially if you are a new captain:

Read through all the following rules: SCTA Regulations, Orange County Local League Rules, The Code (these are all posted on the website: www.orangecountyusta.com) Make sure you make note of the new rule changes for 2008.

Read through all the documents in this notebook and after reading through everything, make sure to ask if you have any questions.

Get your team online and fax me the team information sheet by December 28.

Double-check your players ratings, and make sure you play them correctly according to their current ratings. Make sure partners' ratings are not more than 1.0 apart. (The system will let you record scores, but they will later be defaulted, so be careful here.)

Check the ratings on your roster and make sure anyone who has a 2.0 ratings has it corrected.

Remember you must confirm your match each week with your opponent. Visitors are supposed to contact the home team at least 3 days prior to the match, so if there are any mistakes in the schedule, there is time to catch them and work it out.

Make sure your self-rated players are not rating themselves too low. They are going to be doing random audits on self-rated players, so watch your players.

Monitor your roster and make sure all your players are registered before they play their first match, or they risk being dq'd for any matches they played.

Make sure your players know the rules, and are aware of the deadline dates for any refunds.
